Introduction

Stakeholder Engagement in Data Analysis

A variety of stakeholders will meet regularly to examine academic data and determine root causes in order to drive instruction and improve academic achievement at Carole Highlands. We will involve parents in academic decisions and share current and trending data with them during Title I Parent Orientation, Survey, Second Cup of Coffee, and Back to School Night. Pearson platform, KRA data, Benchmark Data, MCAP, and DIBELS discussions will all be topics with parents throughout the year. Parent involvement on the School Planning and Management Team will also assist in the decision-making process and the monitoring and implementation of our SPP initiatives and data. Meeting on a monthly basis, the team will provide feedback on progress of our SPP action tasks. Our Title I budget also includes Reading, Math, and STEM Nights for families during which time we will review current content data by grade level and share strategies to help parents at home with their students. New for SY23 Carole Highlands will be infusing Arts integration within the instructional program. The UMD Science Cohort will staff college students to create engaging science activities with students. These programs will allow for additional stakeholders to have a voice in our everyday instruction.

Monthly collaborative planning meetings and data discussions will allow school staff to engage in lesson planning and instructional next steps based on data analysis of current data including instructional software and district assessments. The school leadership team will also conduct Learning Walks and class visits to assess instruction, capture data, and progress monitoring. Sample evidence will be housed in our Title I folders (agendas, learning walk notes, etc.)

There will be a number of opportunities that will occur at least quarterly, for parents and community members to give input on our Title I Plan within our SPP. During our Title I Parent Orientation, Second Cup of Coffee, our Parent Academy, Back to School Night and Parent involvement on the School Planning and Management Team, stakeholders will have the opportunity to learn about our SPP and our action steps towards improving instruction. They will have surveys, evaluations, and feedback forms to capture their input on ways to improve our practice. Parents will also have opportunities to review and provide feedback through quarterly parent

instructional nights as well as parenting workshops and our monthly Carole Highlands meetings. Any suggestions offered by parents will be discussed during School Planning and Management Meetings and will be implemented accordingly and SANE documentation will be collected.

 - In addition to our Spring 2022 Title I Parent Input meeting where parents provided feedback and input to our SY23 Parent Plan and Compact, there will be a number of opportunities at least quarterly, for parents and community members to learn about and give input on our Title I Parent Plan and Compact. Our Planning and Management Team will then review all feedback and make adjustments to the documents accordingly. Parent Plans and Compacts will be distributed both in person and electronically by September 30, 2022. As always, parent feedback is seen as a valuable resource to our school community and any feedback that supports our SPP goals and initiatives will be considered within our leadership decisions.  - Stakeholder Input on PFE Allocation

In addition to our Spring 2022 Title I Parent Input meeting where parents provided feedback on our SY23 Title I parent allocation, the Title I Parent Allocation will be shared and feedback will be requested on the following events: Back to School Night, Title I Parent Orientation, Second Cup of Coffee, and during the School Planning and Management Meeting. During the events the school staff will engage stakeholders in discussion around the budget in order to:

 - Blending Resources to Impact Achievement

Local resources are braided to maximize the impact of the Title 1 plan. Being a Community School we have been able to build numerous partnerships to provide school supplies to needy students, gift cards, uniforms and food baskets to families. This helps to provide the social and emotional support to students and families in order for students to focus more on academics and the rigorous instruction provided by the staff. New for SY23 Carole Highlands will be infusing Arts integration within the instructional program. In addition to our community-based partnerships, we coordinate and integrate funding, programs and initiatives with the following Federal-sponsored grants: Title I, Title III, and IDEA to provide coaching for teachers, supplemental resources for students, training for teachers, upgraded technology and software and extended learning opportunities for students. In addition, University of Maryland continues to support the school in building parent capacity and teacher professional growth through sponsoring parent instructional nights such as Reading/Literacy Night, Family Math Night, Technology Night, STEAM Night, etc. SANE documentation will be collected and housed in our evidence folder.
