Mask Policy Update: Friday, August 12:

In light of the highly contagious COVID-19 BA.5 variant, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) will return to a mandatory mask policy in all schools and facilities until further notice, effective Monday, August 15. This decision was recommended by the Prince George's County Health Department.

When responding to public health threats such as COVID-19, Maryland school districts have flexibility in determining mask-wearing policies. In July, PGCPS transitioned from mandatory mask-wearing to a mask-optional policy for the first time since the onset of the pandemic.

Mask policy is subject to change according to local and/or state health department guidance and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations.

SCHOOL HOURS:

Our school hours continue to be 9:15 am - 3:55 pm for students. Doors open at 8:45 am. Students not in their classroom seats by 9:15 a.m. will be marked tardy. Students who leave prior to dismissal at 3:55 pm. will also be marked with a "p.m. tardy" in the SchoolMax system.

TECHNOLOGY:

PGCPS is a one device to each student school system.

- Incoming Kindergarten students will receive "touch-screen" Chromebooks
- Rising 1st grade students will exchange their iPads for a Chromebook
- New incoming students of other grade levels will receive a Chromebook

COMPUTER LOGINS:

Student user names remain the same. In most cases the user name is the student's first name, hyphen, then last name. For example, Kevin Jones' birthday is June 25th. In most cases the log in would be **kevin-jones**; his password is **dkfi0625**. If this basic formula does not work, please contact your child's teacher for assistance. All students will be required to bring their school device daily.

NURSE/HEALTH ROOM UPDATES:

- Families should take care of any outstanding immunizations ASAP
- Parents will need to make an appointment with Nurse Love to coordinate medication/plan drop off
- Students may not self-carry/self-administer medications unless cleared by their primary physician and Nurse
 Love

BUILDING VISITS:

Visitors to the building continue to be required to make an appointment prior to visiting the building. Appointments must be made by calling the school (301) 918-8660, or through direct correspondence with the teacher. At the time of visit, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Only visitors with a scheduled appointment may enter the building
- All visitors (except children under 5) must wear a mask
- Visitors must bring a government-issued photo ID
- Visitors be prepared to have your temperature checked

ATTENDANCE:

School attendance plays a major part in student academic success. Too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school and makes it harder to learn how to read and master foundational math skills. Building good habits helps children learn that going to school on time every day is important. Daily attendance will be closely monitored. The County attendance procedure will be fully implemented. Students who miss more than one day per month are at risk of not meeting the State attendance requirement. To ensure students arrive everyday on time, set a regular bedtime and morning routine. Be sure to lay out clothing and backpacks the night before. Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments or extended trips during school days. Remember to make back-up plans for getting your child to school if something comes up.

DKFI Cleaning Actions/Strategies:

Below are some of the actions that we will continue to help keep our school disinfected, and safe as possible.

- Air Purifiers in every classroom and high traffic areas
- Electro-static misting of hallways, classrooms and all congregated areas
- Increased rotation of cleaning and disinfecting
- Outside learning experiences when appropriate and weather permitting
- Increased soap dispensers, paper towels and hand sanitizers
